SEEDING RESILIENCE: RESEARCH IN ACTION

Reflecting on the experience of seed scarcity during the pandemic (thus, the creation of our own seed bank) I have started a research project partnering with Sussex University and the Gaia Foundation's Seed Sovereignty programme. The aim is to reflect on the pandemic experience as an example of a 'shock' to the food system which impacted seed and seed producers.

This is a subject of great importance in the UK to citizens and policy makers alike - Research has shown that our food system is vulnerable to crisis, but seed is often forgotten when we look at the food system. This is a gap that makes us all the more at risk in terms of food security, considering how few small scale commercial seed producers we have.

Access to seed is one thing, but the skills to grow them is an additional consideration.

This research will feed into DEFRA as advice for the National Food Strategy.

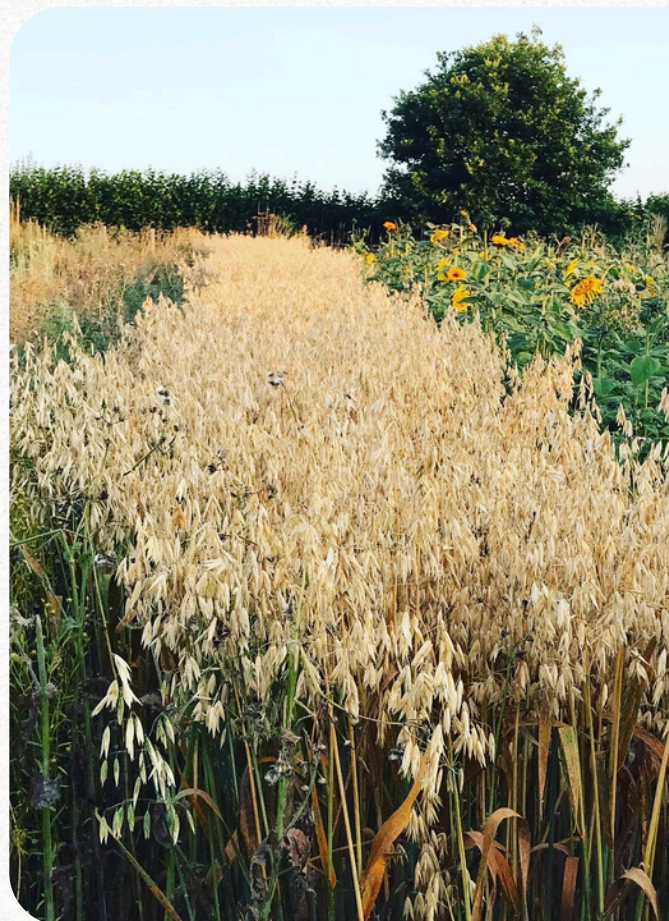
IN-PERSON SEED SAVING TRAINING
